VP TECH REPORT

Douglas W. Cryer, CSI CIPE/CPD VP Technical

Our September Meeting was, as I expected, both interesting and insightful. I found it compelling to listen to Mr. Mark Wesley of the Michigan State Police Task Force on Homeland terrorism and the daunting responsibilities that lie ahead for our State. In addition, Mr. John B ebow of The Detroit News spoke quite to the point about the Detroit Water Department's efforts to keep our water supply safe. John's use of highly regarded doctors and other expert researchers to help compile and critique his data used in his feature articles was equal only to his knowledge, forethought, hands-on investigative approach and professionalism in questioning the Water Department hierarchy about known gaps or lapses in security was alarming.

The bottom line for this meeting was for all of the public and the Plumbing Professionals to be aware of the potential threat, accept new design challenges and keep "Michigan's Greatest Resource", our water supply, safe for generations to come.

Our October Meeting will present the design challenges that Plumbing Professionals face with large Commercial Kitchens. Our expert speaker for the evening will be Mr. Carlos Garcia, F.C.S.I. of Stephens-Bangs Associates, Inc. They are a food service design firm in Southfield, Michigan.

As designers, we are given a set of Food Service Equipment Plans with labeled utilities. It is the Food Service Equipment Design firm's responsibility to meet with the end user to determine use, magnitude of operations and specifically, the placement of the equipment in each department of the food service area and confirm with the Owner the proper orientation with respect to space allocation and ergonomic operational flow. For instance, the cooking areas are usually separated from the food service preparation and washing areas.

The equipment location is one aspect that I found to be very critical when it came to the design and layout of the underground sanitary system. The grease producing equipment, washing areas, the fish department and the toilet waste must all be considered and connected to the main(s) before leaving the building in a fashion that often incorporates crossing pipes, such that the invert elevations do not intersect and are properly vented. Some communities still vary in their installation practices and should be consulted when three compartment sinks, dishwashers and tilting kettles and skillets are provided. I have had to design some systems with exterior grease interceptors, as mandated by the County Jurisdiction's EPA Department with dishwasher greasy waste included in the grease interceptor sizing. I was actually told by the EPA Official what size to specify (1,000 gallons). I did not agree with him, but I was at his mercy for that project. I suggest a phone call to the specific County Health Department be the first priority, before designing one line on the plans.

I will discuss grease trap locations with regard to ergonomics and cleaning and also which appliances or equipment should actually be piped to the interceptor. As I said, some municipalities vary in their requirements. I plan on asking some of the local County Health Departments to attend and possible speak to us about their individual requirements and reasoning as to why.

I hope to cover invert elevation calculations, proper venting design, water hammer locations, backflow prevention and proper air gap distances over indirect waste drains, locations of indirect and direct waste drains and their proper connections. Most of these drain locations are part of Food Service Equipment Design drawings, but they can be altered. If the opportunity for discussion with the Food Service Designer is early enough into the project that the sanitary piping has not been installed, then changes can be incorporated in all the plans, including Architectural since they design the pitch to each floor drain.

Hot water storage quantity, recovery rates and temperature are all very important to the Commercial Kitchen operation. What type of equipment or fixtures gets what temperatures of water? Hot water recirculation is also important so that the correct temperature of water is delivered and maintained throughout the system during operational hours.

As I previously mentioned, I hope to have members of several local Health Department Officials in attendance to clarify their positions and the Kitchen Plan review process. I am sure that some of you have had to fill out and submit calculation sheets to Architects for Health Department approvals and know the work that is involved with that process. I will try to include an overview of these worksheets.

Also, I will present airflow design considerations for area pressurization, Kitchen Hood Design over grease producing appliances and dishwashers, descriptions of hoods and related fire protection. Including natural gas shut off valves, their operation and what is the proper sequence of operations from the HVAC side of the trade. I have a nice handout of a simple sequence of operations for Kitchen Hoods and their related components. I realize that we are a plumbing organization, but with kitchens airflow is just as critical for proper function and operation.

I look forward to your attendance of this meeting and request that you RSVP to me at propress1@comcast.net for reservations prior to our meeting, so I can give an accurate head count to our great caterer.

I also look forward to representing our Eastern Michigan Chapter as VP Technical at the Convention in Dallas. See some of you there.
